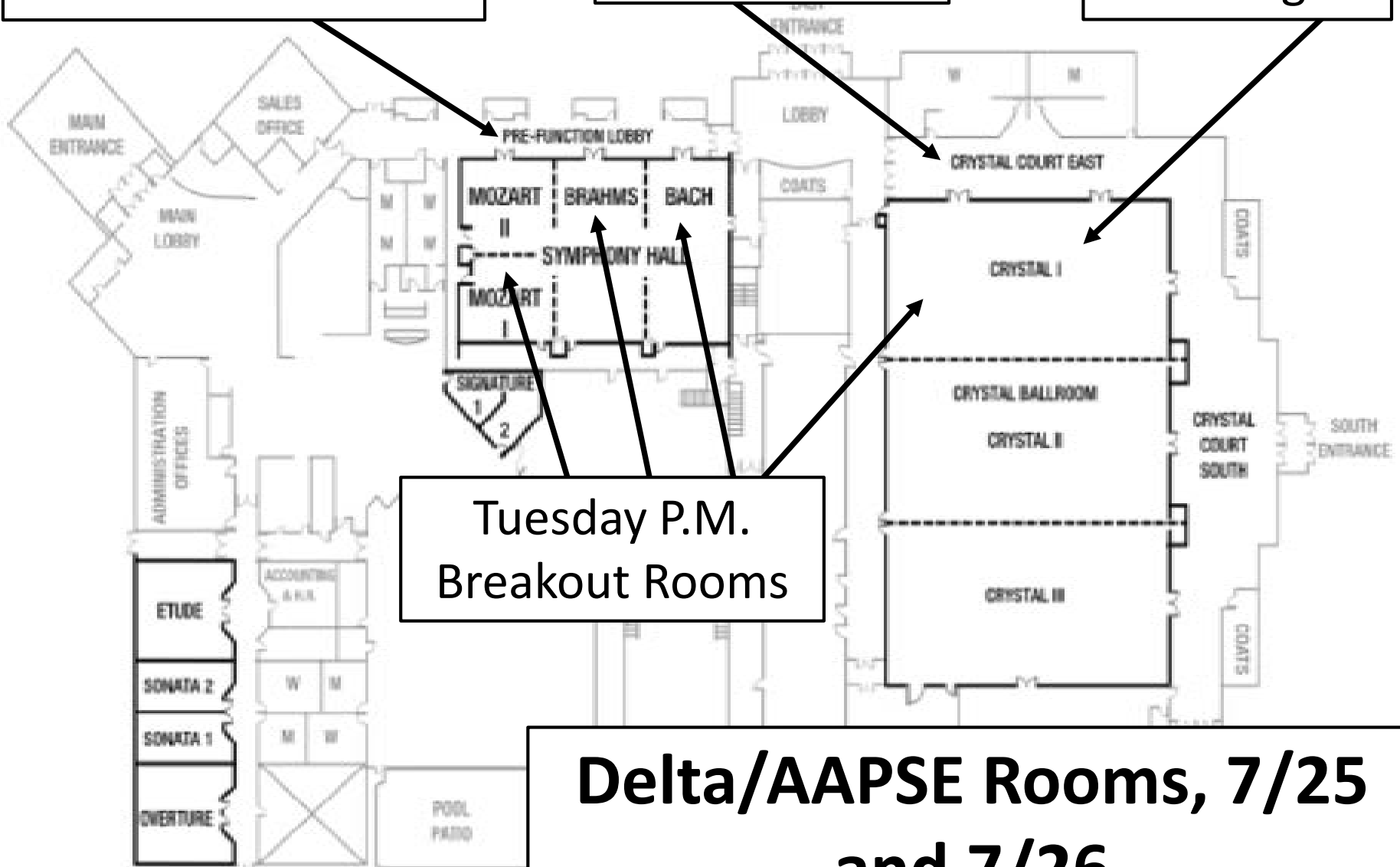
Other useful information for the meetings

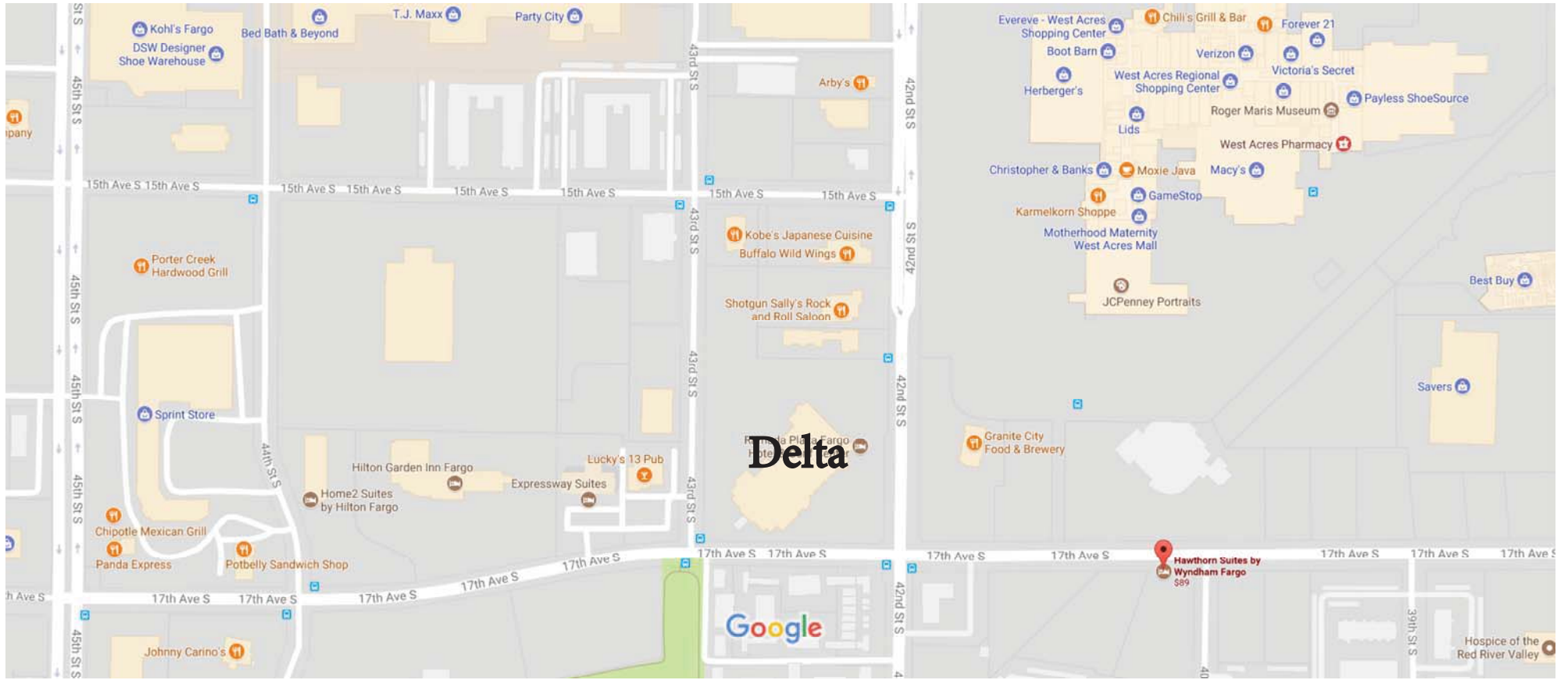
